

REVIVAL-A NECESSITY "Come, Let us Return to the Lord..." Hosea

No one will experience revival without knowing their desperate need of it. Full consideration must be given to the spiritual condition of the heart and personal relationship with the Lord. Hosea, God's prophet, preached to God's people when they had corrupted themselves with idolatry and accompanying immorality. The leadership had opened the door and the people had rushed into sin. King Uzziah had built a nation on military prowess, yet in his power he had neglected to seek the Lord. The temple doors had been closed by King Ahaz. The vessels of the house of God had been cut up. God's people were sacrificing to idols, even offering up their children. Hosea, God's prophet, preaches oncoming judgment and consequences unless God's people see their need for revival.

- 1. Revival is needed when unfaithfulness and idolatry are in the heart of God's people. Hosea 1:2 the land hath committed great whoredom, departing from the LORD... (chapters 1-3) God's people would go after their other lovers rather than their one true love-Jehovah God. When anything or anyone assumes the rightful place of the Lord in the heart, idolatry is committed. Idolatry is nothing short of spiritual unfaithfulness to the Lord. It is spiritual adultery. The Believer is married to Christ, and anything that would come between this precious relationship must be seen as a fox that spoils the precious vine. Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God. (Jam 4:4)
- 2. Revival is needed when the truths of God's Word are neglected and disobeyed. Hosea 4:1, 6, 10 ... the LORD hath a controversy with the inhabitants of the land, because there is no truth, nor mercy, nor knowledge of God in the land. My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge... because they have left off to take heed to the LORD. Hosea 8:12 I have written to him the great things of my law, but they were counted as a strange thing. It is attention to God's Word that will allow God's people to live in a state of revival. God's Word teaches the Believer how to live a life pleasing to the Lord, to live in spiritual victory, to abide in Christ, bring forth fruit, and glorify the Father in Heaven. To despise the Word of the Lord is to take lightly that which sanctifies the life, cleans the heart, guides the mind, and promotes spiritual growth. God's Word is the power source, the breaker box, for revival. When God's people neglect their Bibles, give them less attention than they ought, or simply put less weight in their heart upon God's Word, revival is needed.
- 3. Revival is needed when God's people set their heart upon their iniquity. More than just having iniquity in the heart, this is a setting of the affections upon our sins. Hosea 4:7-8 As they were increased, so they sinned against me...they set their heart on their iniquity. Hosea records the dangers that come with prosperity and affluence. When things are physically well for the Believer he may be tempted to turn from the Lord. Spiritually there may be a temptation to consider ourselves prosperously plateaued. This can lead to carelessness, lack of discipline and diligence. When we are full, sin can easily spring from our deceitful hearts. The heart's affection is to be set upon the Lord rather than upon some sinful practice. Any root of sin must be pulled from the heart and the heart turned again to the Lord. The heart is capable of such passion, and this passion is to be reserved for the Lord. When passion

Lord. The heart is capable of such passion, and this passion is to be reserved for the Lord. When passion for sin is flamed up in the heart of God's people revival is needed. Hosea 7:4 *They are...as an oven hearted*

by the baker...for they have made ready their heart like an oven...in the morning it burneth as a flaming fire... they are all hot as an oven... Desire for sin will lead to passion out of control. Affection should be set upon things above, but sadly many passions are set upon the sparks of sin.

- 4. Revival is needed when God's people have moved any amount of distance from the Lord. Hosea 4:16 For Israel slideth back as a backsliding heifer... Walking after our sinful flesh, God's people still have a bent for backsliding. Hosea 11:7 And my people are bent to *backsliding from me...*The Lord compares His people to a stubborn cow who digs in the feet and backs away from his drivers intended purpose. God's people have done this very thing in stubbornness. Backsliding is to be stubborn, assert in rebellion, to resist. When God's people are resisting the Lord in any area of their lives, revival is needed. Any attitude of rebellion cuts off the revival blessings of the Lord. Backsliding is directional, it causes the child of God to move away from the Lord; it is not a stationary term. Backsliding also carries the Christian farther than he intended. Satan will always provide means to help the backslider move further away from the Lord. Revival is a returning to the Lord, to where I used to stand with Him.
- 5. Revival is needed when spiritual duties are done without heart devotion. Hosea 6:6 For I desired mercy, and not sacrifice; and the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings. When sacrifice, church attendance, singing, and worship can continue without life, without the Spirit of God leading us, we desperately need revival. How sad that God's people can practice outward forms of religious exercise while their heart is not in it. Perhaps this is to appease their conscience, perhaps this is to keep their place in the eyes of others. Certainly this does not bring glory and satisfaction to the Lord. God takes no delight in sacrifice and burnt offering without the accompanying broken and contrite heart. He does not delight when His people tread His courts in a half-hearted manner. He would rather His people be burning hot or ice cold, but certainly not lukewarm. Isaiah 1:11-14

JOHN PLOUGHMAN'S TALK; OR, PLAIN ADVICE FOR PLAIN PEOPLE... **TO THE IDLE**

IT IS of no more use to give advice to the idle than to pour water into a sieve; and as to improving them, one might as well try to fatten a greyhound. Yet, as The Old Book tells us to cast our bread upon the waters," we will cast a hard crust or two upon these stagnant ponds; for there will be this comfort about it: if lazy fellows grow no better, we shall be none the worse for having warned them, for when we sow good sense, the basket gets none the emptier. We have a stiff bit of soil to plow when we chide with sluggards, and the crop will be of the smallest. But if none but good land were farmed, plowmen would be out of work, so we'll put the plow into the furrow.

Idle men are common enough and grow without planting, but the quantity of wit among seven acres of them would never pay for raking: nothing is needed to prove this but their name and character; if they were not fools they would be idlers; and though Solomon says, "The sluggard is wiser in his own conceit than seven men that can render a reason," yet in the eyes of every one else, his folly is as plain as the sun in the sky. If I hit hard while speaking to them, it is because I know they can bear it; for if I had them down on the floor of the old barn, I might thresh many a day before I could get them out of the straw, and even the steam thresher could not do it. It would kill them first; for laziness is in some people's bones and will show itself in their idle flesh, do what you will with them.

This is the slothful man in the Proverbs, who "hideth his hand in his bosom; it grieveth him to bring it again to his mouth." I say that men the like of this ought to be served like the drones which the bees drive out of the hives. Every man ought to have patience and pity for poverty; but for laziness, a long whip or a turn at the treadmill might be better. This would be a healthy purgative for all sluggards; but there is no chance of some of them getting their full dose of this medicine, for they were born with silver spoons in their mouths, and like spoons will scarce stir their own tea unless somebody lends them a hand. They are, as the old proverb says, as lazy as Ludham's dog, that leaned his head against the wall to bark"; and like lazy sheep, it is too much trouble for them to carry their own wool. If they could see themselves, it might by chance do them a world of good; but perhaps it would be too much trouble for them to open their eyes even if the glass were hung for them.

Everything in the world is of some use; but it would puzzle a doctor of divinity, or a philosopher, or the wisest owl in our steeple to tell the good of idleness: that seems to me to be an ill wind which blows nobody any good—a sort of mud which breeds no eels, a dirty ditch which would not feed a frog. Sift a sluggard grain by grain, and you'll find him all chaff. I have heard men say, better do nothing than do mischief but I am not even sure of that: that saying glitters well, but I don't believe it's gold. I grudge laziness even that pinch of praise; I say it is bad and bad altogether. For look ye, a man doing mischief is a sparrow picking the corn—but a lazy man is a sparrow sitting on a nest full of eggs, which will all turn to sparrows before long and do a world of hurt.

Don't tell me—I'm sure of it—that the rankest weeds on earth don't grow in the minds of those who are busy at wickedness but in foul concerns of idle men's imaginations, where the devil can hide away unseen like an old serpent as he is. I don't like our boys to be in mischief, but I would sooner see them up to their necks in the mud in their larks than sauntering about with nothing to do. If the evil of doing nothing seems to be less today, you will find it out to be greater tomorrow; the devil is putting coals on the fire, and so the fire does not blaze; but depend upon it, it will be a bigger fire in the end. Idle people, you had need be your own trumpeters, for no one else can find any good in you to praise.

I'd sooner see you through a telescope than anything else, for I suppose you would then be a long way off; but the biggest pair of spectacles in the parish could-not see anything in you worth talking about. Moles, and rats, and weasels, there is something to be said for, though there's a pretty sight of them nailed up on our old barn; but as for you, you'll be of use in the grave and help to make a fat churchyard, but no better song can I sing in your favor than this verse, as the parish clerk said, gall of my own composing":

A good-for-nothing lazy lout, Wicked within and ragged without. Who can bear to have him about? Turn him out! Turn him out!

- V. Always Abstain from anything that will foster the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life (the world) in the hearts of those who live in your home. Satan can use these to get a foothold.
- *VI. Nurture Accountability* with your young people for their personal time, entertainment, music, friendships, and electronic devices.
- *VII. Live Authentic* in front of the lives of your young person—teaching through example.
- *VIII. Do Avoid* placing confidence in yourself and those young people in your home—never trust the power of the flesh!
- IX. Stay Available to devote your time, energy, money, and wisdom into the life of your young person. Don't allow them to navigate the teen years on their own—they will crash on the rocks!
- *X.* **Daily Arm** yourself and your family with the spiritual weapons provided—Every Day: pray for your children privately and pray with them publicly.


